**SPRINGFIELD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
BUSINESS MEETING
FEBRUARY 3, 2026
7:00 P.M.**

Present: Supervisors Marcus Kohan, Tim Stiffy, and Willie Hohmann. Also present Jim Knight Road Foreman, and Lucinda Lipko Township Administrator. Jim Naret, Township Engineer joined via conference call.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Agenda Additions or Deletions: None

Public Comment: None

Fire Department Report: No report.

Administration and Finance:

Discussion of the award of \$ 300,000.00 from PA Small Water and Sewer. The Township still needs \$66,000.00. The electrical components for the wet well at Pine Township will cost around \$100,000.00. The amount the Township applied for was \$498,000.00.

Discussion of water agreement with Grove City Borough. The board questioned how many fire hydrants are needed and what the cost of the hydrants will be if we get water from Grove City.

A motion was made by Tim Stiffy to approve the quote from SEI for \$ 9,154.00 for a new spreader. Seconded by Willie Hohmann, motion carried.

A motion was made by Tim Stiffy to retroactively approve bereavement leave for Dawson Kerr on January 5, 2026. Seconded by Willie Hohmann, motion carried.

A motion was made by Tim Stiffy to approve purchasing, under the Agility Agreement, 1,200 tons of grindings from PennDOT at \$5.00 per ton. Seconded by Willie Hohmann, motion carried.

Zoning and Land Development: 5 building permits were issued in January 2026.

Sewer and Water: Lift Stations are running well since adding the additive.

Roads and Bridges:

They have been salting and plowing roads since the last major storm.

\$100,000 that was budgeted for the sealcoating. Jim would like to double seal Oregon Road, Pine Road, Bottlehill Road and the Bottlehill Dead End will all be single sealed. He would also like to get quotes to pave the Office and Garage parking lots.

McClymonds has stated that they are currently out of salt. This is due to the lakes being frozen over and the barges cannot get through. Jim advised that he has a call directly to our salt suppliers, but has not heard back yet.

Engineer's Report:

Jim Naret reported a Planning Module Exemption Mailer for Mystery Mayhem Escapes and Axe Throwing was approved. Lucinda signed it and sent it in.

Public Works Report: Jim has not heard from DEP in 3 months. DEP has not received any complaints, so they were closing their file.


Public Comment:
