Notice is hereby given by the Board of Supervisors of Springfield Township, Mercer County, Pennsylvania, that they will conduct a public hearing on the adoption of Ordinance No. 4-2020, which is an Ordinance amending the Township of Springfield, Mercer County, Pennsylvania Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance numbered Township Ordinance 02-2017 to add definitions and revise requirements for recording plans. The public hearing will be held on October 6, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. at the Springfield Township Building located at 406 Old Ash Road, Mercer, Pennsylvania. Additional notice is hereby given that at the same time as set forth above and at the same location, the Springfield Township Board of Supervisors will conduct a public hearing on the adoption of Ordinance No. 5-2020, which amends the Township Zoning Ordinance No. 1-2016 as amended by Ordinance 4-2018 as amended to add definitions, a permitted uses summary chart, special event barn/venue, medical marijuana grower/processor, solar energy facility, and mobile food vendors as authorized uses with specified regulations for each, and providing for severability and repeal of prior inconsistent ordinances.
